Work with a partner. Use the information below.

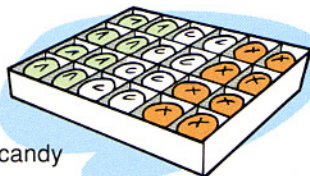
Student A: You are a foreign visitor to Japan. You want to buy some souvenirs for your family members and friends. Ask Student B for ideas.

Student B: You work in a gift shop. Recommend souvenirs for Student A to buy.

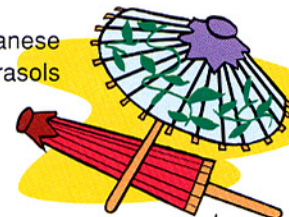

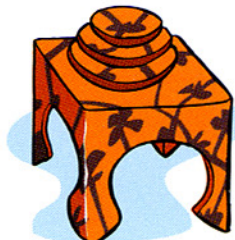
