Tips of Shadoku

- · Start shadowing from very easy and fun picture books
 - which the audio is slow enough to 'shadow'
 - which has sufficiently small number of words and enable learners to guess the story from pictures while shadowing
- Do shadowing multiple times per book each time in a different way
- · Guess the scene and characters' feelings while shadowing

When you read, do you translate English to Japanese? Students have no experience at international schools


Ummm... (I never thought about it...) I usually think in English when I read books.
