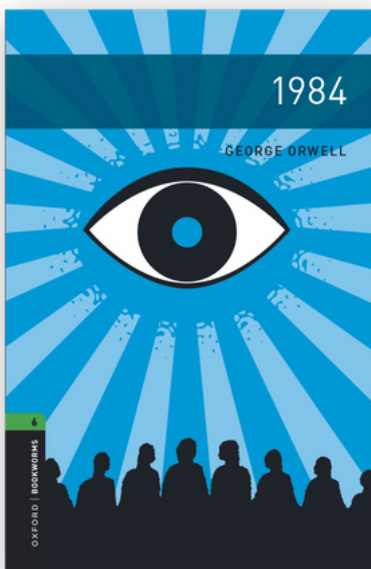

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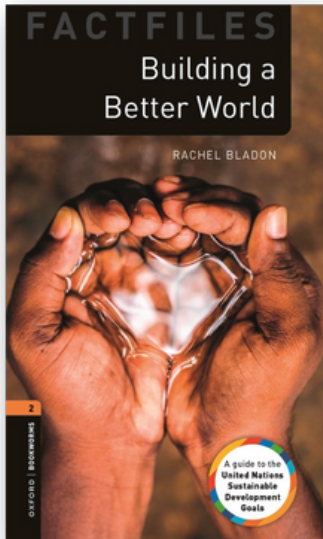

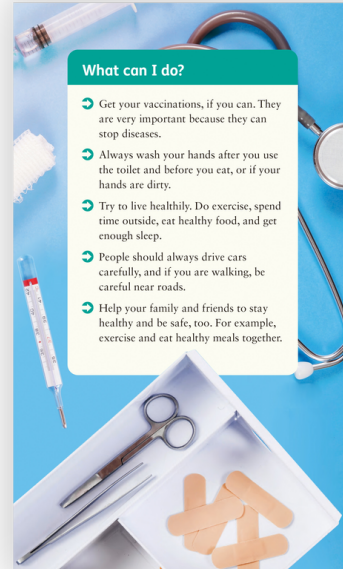

Everyone must have a good education and opportunities to learn.

Education is very important because it changes people's lives. For example, when a person has been to school, they can get a good job more easily – so, education reduces poverty and hunger. This is why there must be equality in education: all boys and girls must go to school and have the same opportunities.

In the last ten years, there have been more people in education than before. But in 2018, there were still 260 million children and young people who were not in school. For every four children in the classroom, one child somewhere in the world does not get an education.

She argued that there was not enough serious action on the climate emergency, and she finished her talk by saying, "Right here, right now is where we draw the line. The world is waking up. And change is coming, whether you like it or not!" Some of the people in the room shouted in agreement, but others looked uncomfortable. Sixteen-year-old Greta Thunberg had given one of the most determined and angry talks in the history of the United Nations.

Thunberg had started her work as a climate campaigner just over a year earlier when she sat alone outside the Swedish Parliament. She was unafraid to break the rules to achieve her goals, and her honest way of speaking and campaigning had inspired people and made them listen. In just twelve months, millions of young protesters had followed her call to march through their own towns and cities.

Climate change is still not being taken seriously enough and much more still needs to happen. But Thunberg started an important conversation and made people around the world take notice of the climate emergency. Through her actions she has made a big difference and continues to make a difference to this day.

"If you want to do something, go for it."

It is the 12th of April 1961, and in Tatebayashi, a small city in Japan, a nine-year-old girl is listening to the news on the radio with great interest. The Russian astronaut Yuri Gagarin has just climbed into a spacecraft and flown high around the Earth, becoming the first person ever to travel into space. Like many others listening to the news that day, Chiaki Mukai was very excited by Yuri Gagarin's adventure. But this young girl did not imagine for a moment that she could ever follow his journey into space. At that time, the Japanese space programme was very small, and there were no Japanese astronauts at all, so the idea that Mukai could become an astronaut herself one day seemed impossible.

But the 1960s were a very exciting time for anyone who was interested in space. This was because of the famous 'space race' between the Soviet Union (which was made of Russia and many other countries) and the US, with both nations trying to be the first to explore space.
